RE: Electronic Submission Naming Convention

ATTENTION: Electronic Submission Reporting Personnel

Effective January 1, 2008, the Wisconsin Compensation Rating Bureau (WCRB) will be adopting ACCCT's file naming convention for all electronic submissions sent to WCRB. This change will only affect files submitted from your own system directly to CDX via Web upload, FTP, or email. The Web BEEP & PEEP products currently use this naming convention, and the desktop BEEP product uses a comparable naming convention that is built into the application.
